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Loud Fridge Theatre Group finishes their inaugural season with the San Diego premiere of **ZACH** by local playwright Christian St. Croix, directed by Michael Amira and running at OnStage Playhouse in Chula Vista. **ZACH** previews on Friday, October 13, opens on Saturday, October 14, and runs through Saturday, October 28; performances are Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays at 7:30pm and Sundays at 4:00pm. Director Michael Amira shared: "What drew me to take the helm for ZACH was the power of a story that artfully portrays the essence of self- identification through a lens of creativity, vibrancy, youth, and joy. Equally enticing was the prospect of collaborating once more with the dynamic force that is Loud Fridge Theatre Group, an emerging powerhouse that embodies its mission with unwavering action.

As a black woman hailing from California, and as someone who once navigated the tumultuous terrain of high school, ZACH struck a chord deep within. It serves as a poignant vehicle for catharsis, inviting us to confront the façades we wear for the world, reconcile with our past struggles, forgive our former selves, and eagerly embrace the individuals we are destined to become.

At its core, ZACH delivers a powerful narrative that explores the transformative journey to internal liberation."

About ZACH

A satirical comedy that lovingly skewers the popular tropes of the 90s teen sitcom, ZACH introduces us to the lives and loves of two teens of color at an affluent, majority-white Southern Californian high school. P.J., a lovesick surfer boy, and Gina, a budding fashionista, are overjoyed when they're invited into the inner circle of Zach, the white, charismatic, prank-happy new kid at school. But when Zach plans a prank that goes too far, P.J. and Gina must race to stop him before it's too late — and along the way, learn to see their peers, and themselves, with fresh eyes.

The cast features two rising stars from San Diego State University, Sergio Morejon and Kendall Stallworth, who create a total of 13 characters over the course of the fast-paced 90-minute show.
